
Now offering ESKATA treatment for Seborrheic Keratoses



During your skin exam, your dermatologist may diagnose you with having seborrheic keratoses (SKs) that appear as raised, dark, wart-like benign

growths. These harmless spots can pop up anywhere on the skin as we age, regardless of our skin care regimen. You may have had these spots treated in the past with the cold spray of liquid nitrogen but they can now be treated with the only FDA-approved topical treatment called ESAKTA.

ESKATA is an in-office treatment of raised SKs, applied by your dermatologist, and then re-evaluated approximately 3 weeks after treatment. Additional application can be applied if needed, or alternative therapy can be done to resolve any remaining stubborn SKs. Although not covered by insurance due to the benign nature of the lesions, we do offer affordable ESKATA treatments.



MELANOMA - Get Informed

Melanoma is the most deadly of all skin cancers and the least common, although 1 in 70 people are estimated to be diagnosed with it. Melanomas can appear anywhere, but in men they are most commonly found on the back and in women on the legs. It occurs in the skin cells that make pigment, which tans the skin. The spots are most often dark brown or black spots or bumps. Melanomas can appear suddenly without warning, in/near




an existing mole, or in a large congenital mole. If caught early and treated, it is almost always curable. Melanomas tend to spread or metastasize, so early treatment is essential. The most important step you can take is to have any changing mole examined by a dermatologist.

Use the ABCDE's to monitor changes:

- A) Asymmetry One half of the mole doesn't match the other half.
- **B)** Border irregularity The edges are ragged, notched or blurred.
- **C)** Color The color is not uniform, shades of tan, brown and black are present (rarely red, white & blue).
- **D)** Diameter The width is greater than six millimeters (size of a pencil eraser) or growing rapidly.
- **E)** Evolving Rapidly changing, difference in size, shape, color or elevation.

Risk Factors for Melanoma: Family history of Melanoma; Fair skinned, blueeyed person who does not tan; Person with greater than 50 moles or atypical moles; Having 3 blistering sunburns in childhood; Having extensive freckling over the shoulders; Working an outside summer job as a teen.

Practice periodic self-examinations to aid in early recognition of any new or developing lesion.


